For 5 and a half years Lynne traveled for the Air Force on her many assignments taking her to Virginia, Maine, Texas and California. Ultimately in 1990, Lynne was deployed to Oman and Kuwait in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm where she served as a combat trauma flight and surgical nurse. Lynne returned from her deployment in 1991 and shortly thereafter she and Dennis started their family.
